ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: GENERAL FUNCTION

- To provide a welcoming, safe, and clean home environment for the resident families we serve in accordance with established Shelter Policy and Procedures and governed by Provincial Health and Safety regulations
- To follow standardized menus for meal preparation and prepare serve, clean up after meals

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBITIES

- Respond sensitively to clients, nutritional, emotional, and physical needs
- Report health and safety concerns to the Deputy Director
- Complete general cleaning duties in accordance with the established cleaning schedule and task lists
- Launder and organize the kitchen and house laundry
- Follow standardized menus for meal preparation and prepare, serve, clean up after meals; attend to client dietary needs as required
- Maintain a high degree of safety, security, and confidentiality at all times
- Perform other related work as assigned by the Executive Director or Deputy Director

WORKING CONDITIONS AND PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS



- Requirement to work in a busy, noisy environment with many interruptions
- Physical requirements bending, reaching, lifting objects, navigating stairs, lifting groceries
- Requirement to handle unpleasant situations, including cleaning up bodily fluids
